SAVANHDARY VONGPOOTHORN

Born in Laos, 1971, Vongpoothorn came to Australia in 1979. She completed a Bachelor of Visual Arts at the University of Western Sydney and a Masters of Fine Arts at UNSW College of Fine Arts. She has undertaken numerous residencies in Australia and overseas including in Scotland, Japan, Singapore, Vietnam and India. In 2006, Vongpoothorn was commissioned to create a major new work for the 15th Biennale of Sydney, she was a finalist in the 2016 Sir John Sulman Prize and in 2019 The Drill Hall Gallery, Canberra will stage a survey exhibition of her work. Vongpoothorn's work is included in many important public, private and corporate collections, including the National Gallery of Australia, Canberra; World Bank, New York; Artbank, Sydney; Queensland Art Gallery | Gallery of Modern Art, Brisbane; Art Gallery of New South Wales, Sydney; and the National Gallery of Victoria, Melbourne. She currently lives and works in Canberra.
