Mabel Juli Wirroongoon is a senior Gija artist and law and culture woman at Warmun. Juli began painting in the 1980s alongside celebrated East Kimberley artist Queenie McKenzie, encouraged by Rover Thomas and inspired by her brother Rusty Peters. Mabel Juli's work has been included in over one hundred group and a number of solo exhibitions. Juli has been a finalist in the prestigious *Telstra National Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Art Award* eight times and is the recipient of the 2013 *Kate Challis RAKA Award for Visual Arts.* Mabel Juli's work is shown courtesy of Warmun Art Centre.
